



SIGINIFICANT ITEMS CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING July 1, 2025

- 1. Monies received from the sale of the International Guest House have been spent and were used to cover the cost of the kitchen remodeling and the generator. Net expense to the congregation is currently about \$200.00.
- 2. Sherry Abel is to be commended for planning the bus trip to Sight & Sound. There are about 9 kids going along, people from the community, and some who were former church attendees, extended families, etc.
- 3. Council agreed that the fireplace in the gym should be completely closed off so that it cannot be used. Also, since the chimney was damaged in the storm, it will be taken down and closed off. The roof and trim will then be extended to look as if the chimney was never there.
- 4. The Pastor Search Committee has invited a possible pastoral candidate to visit in July during the Tri-State Relief Sale weekend. He will get to meet some of our people and experience some activities here.
- 5. Wengerd Roofing estimates \$9,000 to \$12,000 to replace the roof over the gym wing of the church and fix storm damage there as well. The estimated amount we will receive from the insurance company is about \$14,000, which would be more than enough to cover the work. Council agreed to go ahead with the work whenever Wengerd's can work it into their schedule.
