

SIGNIFICANT ITEMS Church Council Meeting December 2, 2025

- 1. Council approved the draft amendment to the by-laws giving more freedom for the Gifts Discernment Committee and other leadership to use non-members when necessary. A copy will be placed in the bulletin to be voted on as soon as possible.
- 2. Council reviewed the November and first quarter financial reports.
- 3. The Trustees will be adding more handicap parking spaces in the Spring.
- 4. The Trustees will be working on floors and painting in the secretary's office and the pastor's office after the first of the year.
- 5. Food is being donated for those in need and is brought to the church. We will alternate giving it to the food banks in Grantsville and Meyersdale.

The holiday season is a special time to remember and connect with members of our community who may not have regular access to church mailboxes. To ensure that everyone receives Christmas cards, please follow the guidelines below for distributing cards to those in nursing homes and others without a church mailbox.

- Mabel Beiler and Doretha Hoover do not have a church mailbox. Please place their Christmas cards in the basket located on the offering box table. They both are currently at Goodwill Nursing Home.
- Lisa Durst Frye is currently residing at Patriot Nursing Home in Somerset. Cards for Lisa should also be placed in the basket. Arrangements will be made to mail these cards to her.
- If you know of anyone else who does not have a church mailbox, please place their cards in the basket as well. We will make sure they receive their Christmas greetings.

Notes:

Council has had a request from the Gifts Discernment Committee to allow for non-members to serve in some positions when slots cannot be filled with members as required by our Bylaws. Enos and Isaac Tice worked on an amendment that would allow this until the Bylaws can be revised, and Council revised the proposed amendment as follows. The congregation will be asked for affirmation on January 11, 2026.

Article X. GRANTING EXCEPTIONS FOR POSITIONS TO BE FILLED

The following exceptions are being granted through fiscal year 2026-2027 to allow time for the Plan of Organization of the Springs Mennonite Church to be updated.

- A) From time to time the Gifts Discernment Committee, Church Council, or Elders may find it difficult to fill positions that require church membership. When that occurs, and non-members considered to be good candidates for the needed position(s) have been identified, the Gifts Discernment Committee may request the Elders or Council, as appropriate, to grant an exception. Church Council and the Elders can decide if an exception is appropriate for any positions they need to fill.
- B) In some cases, the position to be filled no longer seems to be needed. Elders can grant the exception for not filling positions they or the Gifts Discernment Committee fill and Church Council can grant that exception for positions they fill.

The Elders, Council, and the Gifts Discernment Committee are all agreed to try this process.
