All: The Lord will wrap us in robes of righteousness.

Confession

Leader: Today in this safe and holy place

we become aware of your presence, God.

We focus now on our congregation and the

wider Anabaptist Mennonite Church family.

People: We are a faithful church, but sometimes we've kept our riches to ourselves.

Leader: Sometimes we have excluded the inquirer who has come to our door seeking faith. Sometimes we've refused to admit our weakness. Sometimes we've been too quiet in the land. Sometimes we've helped those far away but ignored our neighbors. Sometimes we've tried so hard to serve that we've forgotten the joy of worshiping you. Hear out honest confessions, O God, and remember us in mercy.

People: Restore to us the joy of being faithful people.

All: Restore our joy, O God of hosts; let your face shine, that we may be saved.

[observe a moment of silence]

All: Come, have mercy on us.

Assurance

Leader: The Lord has done great things in and through his church, and has bestowed rich blessings on us, his Anabaptist people.

People: When we place our lives into your hands, O God, you willingly transform our timid hearts with your infectious joy.

All: Come, walk in the joy of Christ.
