Allegheny Mennonite Fall Faith and Life gathering at University Mennonite Church in State College, PA was attended by Doug and Harriet Berg, Shirley Brandes, Don Green, Karin Miller, Molly Piwonka, Julia Tice, Enos Tice and Phoebe Wiley on November 3, 2018. We left in the dark and rain accompanied by a crescent moon; as dawn broke and the rain subsided we were accompanied most of the rest of the way by a rainbow!

We were welcomed at University by a delicious brunch and joyful fellowship. Then we adjourned to the sanctuary for a time of worship: music, scripture and a short message by Kate Heinzel, UMC's new pastor. This was followed by roll call, staff reports, approval of 8/4/2018 minutes and an update by Doug Berg vis a vis Springs Conference affiliation. All shared in a time of prayer and blessing. University and the Third Way Collective both shared their stories to a response of much affirmation, prayer and blessing. The AMC Polity and Purpose statement was adopted. A final report from the Affiliation Task Force stated that AMC will remain a separate conference within MCUSA with a strategic collaboration with Central District Conference from whom we have already received many resources.

Karin Miller, treasurer, provided a financial update which was followed by discussion of options to achieve a sustainable budget.

Dave Swanson, pastor of Pittsburgh Mennonite Church, shared their congregation's response and grief about the terrible tragedy at the near-by synagogue. We sang together a new hymn written for this time and this situation. PMC has been involved in interfaith efforts and will continue with renewed urgency. At Dave's suggestion it was decided that the tree-of-life Mosaic which was assembled at our August AMC gathering will be gifted to this synagogue. A time of intercessory prayer for this stricken synagogue concluded our gathering.
