SIGNIFICANT ITEMS CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

August 2, 2022

1. Michelle Maust attended the meeting to present some of her ideas for an end of summer carnival. She hopes to have food, games, a bouncy house, and more on Sept. 17, from Noon to 4 PM.
2. Council agreed to continue the outreach of children's packets, but to cut back to packets being distributed only four times a year.
3. Next Council meeting will be held on Sept. 13. Both incoming and outgoing Council members should attend.
4. Council reviewed the contributions to Allegheny Mennonite Conference. From each quarterly offering, \$500 is designated for Mennonite Mission Network and \$500 is designated for Mennonite Media. It was proposed that we change next year's budget to show a budget line item for each of these organizations so that 100% of each Conference offering will go to Allegheny Mennonite Conference. It was also proposed that the \$2000 per quarter minimum will remain, and the \$5000 maximum be raised to \$6000.
5. A schedule has been prepared for Fellowship Time to resume in Sept.
6. Wendy has made some changes and updates to the church website. Take a look!
7. The purchase and installation of a new steam boiler has not progressed as planned. Therefore, at this late juncture, council has decided it to be in our best interest to bring the current boiler into code compliance.
8. This coming weekend is Allegheny Conference's summer delegate session at Laurelville. Proceeds from the sales of the International Guest House will be distributed to the conference member churches. Council designated Isaac Tice to receive the check on behalf of our church.
9. Council appointments for the coming church year were considered and contacts will be made.
