September 13, 2022

- 1) There was more discussion of the amount of money that goes to Allegheny Mennonite Conference. After some discussion and explanation of the August proposal, Council agreed to make separate line items for Mennonite Mission Network and Mennonite Education. The minimum quarterly AMC offering amount will be set at \$2000 and the maximum to remain at \$5000 as it was in the past.
- 2) The furnace repairs have been made at a cost of \$5823.00, and the furnace is ready for re-inspection.
