AED (Automated External Defibrillator) is located at the back of the church near the elevator.



Update on Molly's Missions work: Molly, along with the group from EMU, have lived in Johannesburg, Soweto, Pretoria and Cape Town. They are currently staying in Pietermaritzburg, South Africa.

Molly writes about the group's visit to Soweto: As we drove through the streets and made a few stops such as the Hector Pieterson memorial, we learned about the unfortunate circumstances the people living in the area deal with. Small houses, made in cheap ways, and with very little resources, cover the neighborhoods. These houses may be small, but as Andrew Suderman says: the homes within are large because of the warmth and hospitable spirit of the people. There might not be much space, but those that live in Soweto are very welcoming and hospitable; happily willing to add another to their compacted living spaces. This community also radiates hope. These streets are painted in streams of colors. Blue, red, green, yellow, purple, and orange. Those living in Soweto experience a good deal of creativity. From advertisements painted on walls, to street vendors, to full-out murals, every corner contains something interesting. This street art helps to keep the atmosphere alive and shows how it can uplift those around it with its bright and colorful nature. Art is culture, and even though those in Soweto have dealt with many harsh realities and pain, they seem to show up day in and day out with welcoming spaces and creative spirits that no one can ever take away.

A testimony from a lifelong member at Springs:

Dear Pastor John,

I have been a member of Springs Church all my life. I have gone to other churches but have never joined. I must tell you, miracles do happen every day. I lost my husband 3 years ago and I wear my wedding band on one hand and his on the other.

My son and I were outside raking leaves and branches in our yard, and after about an hour we were ready to quit for the day when I realized my wedding band was missing. My son put a message on Facebook to see if anyone had a metal detector. I prayed so hard to God to help us find my ring. You must realize we had years of leaves and branches on the edge of the woods, and somewhere was my ring.

The next thing my son did was go to a friend's house, who said we could use his detector, but when he came back the detector didn't work. Our neighbor then walked over with his. Then another friend of my son, and another friend of my husband and me came. Finally, a man messaged and said he would come help; he didn't even know us.

After several hours of searching, it seemed really impossible when a friend yelled out, "I found it in a pile of brush that was at least 3 feet deep!".

So yes, John, miracles do happen!

Lenten Visuals: This final Sunday of Lent with our theme, 'Created in the Image of God, shaped by Jesus,' we are 'called to worship.' For the past five weeks we have thought about what it means to be images of the God who created us; what it means to be called by Jesus; and what is the Spirit's role within and among us—our becoming truly human. We can only be reshaped when we open space in our lives for God to work. Jesus' life, death, and resurrection calls us and transforms us into a new way of being human only as we welcome and claim his redeeming work of love in and for us. The Christ candle is a reminder of the focus of the Lenten season—the life, teachings, and passion of Christ.

Today the purple ribbon on the candle represents worship, Palm Sunday, and the passion of Christ.
