John 20:1-16

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance.² So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"³ So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. ⁴ Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in.⁶ Then Simon Peter came along behind him and went straight into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, ⁷ as well as the cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus' head. The cloth was still lying in its place, separate from the linen.⁸ Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. ⁹ (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.)¹⁰ Then the disciples went back to where they were staying. ¹¹Now Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb ¹² and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot. ¹³ They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?" "They have taken mv Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him."¹⁴ At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. ¹⁵ He asked her, "Woman, why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him."¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic. "Rabboni!" (which means "Teacher").

SIGNIFICANT ITEMS CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING April 4, 2023

- 1. After considering questions and answers from the Cemetery Committee, proposed guidelines will be drafted for further review by the Council and the Cemetery Committee.
- 2. The treasurer presented a group of financial reports including a summary for February, March, the second quarter of the church year, and a six-month report for 2022-23.
- 3. The Trustees will be working on several necessary, but minor, repairs.
- 4. The Sound Room & Video personnel have advised Council that the projector may soon need to be replaced. The replacement cost is estimated at \$5700.00. The technicians will be authorized to confirm the quote with the intent to proceed with the purchase of a new projector.
- 5. Elders reported on plans for outdoor services during the month of July.
- 6. There are plans for an end-of-school carnival in June as well as a parade float for Grantsville Days. We will be able to promote Vacation Bible School at both events.
- 7. The council gave further discussion to the idea of buying a generator so that the church could be used as a shelter or warming station during power outages or inclement weather. It was mentioned that perhaps the Allegheny Conference/International Guest House money could be used for the project as this would be an extension of our hospitality to our community.
