

SIGNIFICANT ITEMS CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING July 5, 2023

- 1. The council approved the final draft of the Cemetery Guidelines. Copies will be distributed in church mailboxes as well as through the Cemetery Committee.
- 2. Paul will contact those serving in council-appointed positions to ascertain their willingness to continue to serve in those positions.
- 3. The Trustees reported on maintenance issues to be resolved before winter.
- 4. Bible School went well with approximately 30 students attending.
- 5. Services will continue to be held outdoors through the month of July if the weather permits.
- 6. Summer children's activities are being planned and include a Christmas in July party, an overnight campout, and fishing.
