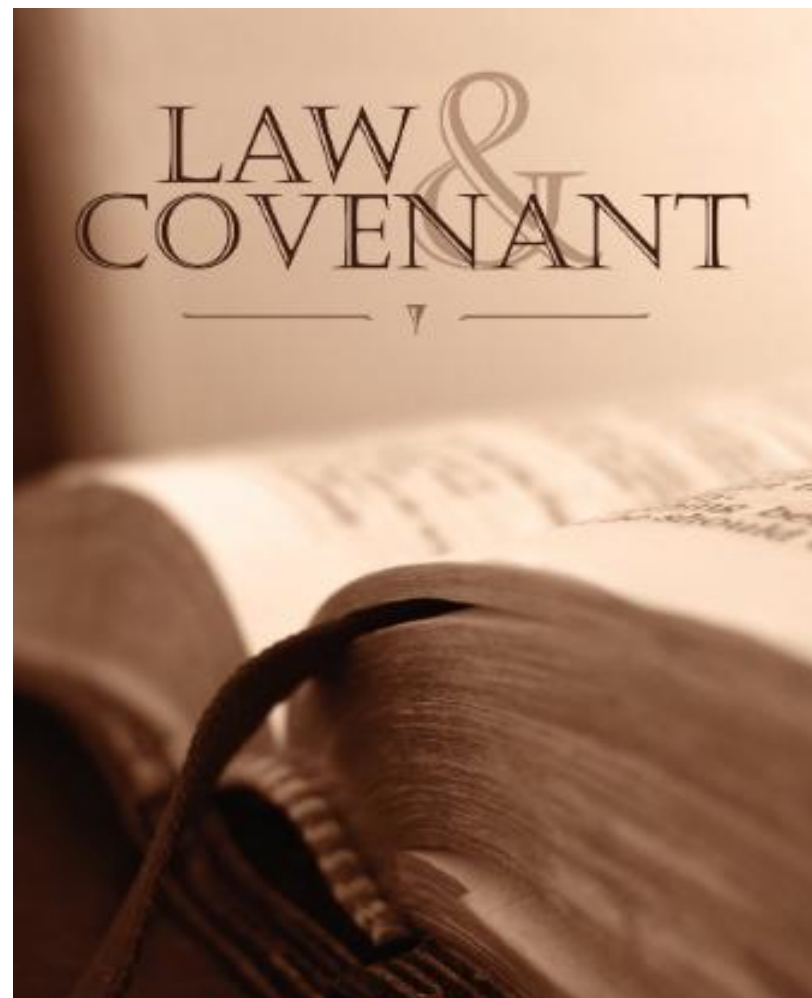

SIGNIFICANT ITEMS
Congregational Meeting
October 24, 2024

1. Paul Durst opened the meeting by thanking the members in attendance followed by a prayer.
2. The members present reviewed the annual report booklet.
3. It was noted that the budget printed in the report booklet was not correct -- it was for the previous church year. A new page showing the correct church budget was distributed. Paul asked if the members present wanted to move ahead with the budget discussion or if they wanted to wait until they had more time to study the corrected version. It was decided to move forward with the budget approval process. After some discussion and clarification, the corrected budget was approved.
4. Review of the annual report booklet continued with corrections noted as we moved forward. Several committee reports need to be updated.
5. With all of the changes listed for the report booklet, it will be decided by Council whether to print an addendum page for the booklet, or to reprint it in its entirety.
6. The meeting concluded with a recap of the major maintenance and repair projects that were done this church year.

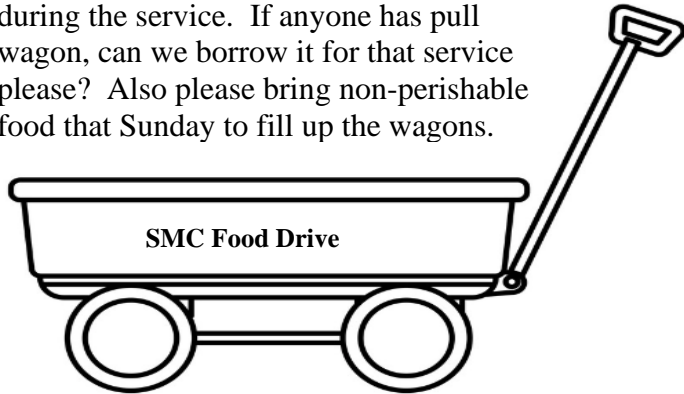
