

There are extra questionnaires on the credence stand.


Children's Church Help Needed

Significant Items **Elders' Meeting - January 14, 2026**

1. The meeting began with a focused discussion regarding the selection of speakers for the upcoming months, beginning in February. Various options and strategies were considered to ensure a diverse and engaging speaking program for the congregation.
 - a. One suggestion involved incorporating video presentations as part of the speaking segment of the service. For example, a video could feature individuals who live outside our local area. The video may be scheduled approximately every other month to maintain variety and engagement.
 - b. A list was made for potential speakers.
 - c. Joy Cotchen will be speaking on February 1st.
