



Significant Items Church Council Meeting January 6, 2026

1. Council briefly discussed more ideas to help those who are having trouble hearing during our services. We mentioned a Live Transcribe program that works with android phones and an app that goes along with certain hearing aids as possibilities that we could help people find on their own.
2. The Floor Store has been contacted again about flooring for the church offices. Estimated cost is around \$3600 to \$5000 depending upon what materials we choose, and whether or not we do the attached hallway, too.
3. The Elders and the Pastor Search Committee have been talking with a pastor about possibly coming here.
4. The Elders are also working on guest speakers for the time after Wes leaves. Council also discussed new traditions and ways of worship that we have learned from Wes.
